LANDEALL FOUNDATION AWARDS 59 GRANTS TOTALING \$231,655

WILMINGTON, NC—The Landfall Foundation today (Nov. 3, 2011) presented checks to 59 agencies to fund projects in the greater Wilmington area totaling \$231,655. The number of foundation grants is up this year from 54 agencies that received grants in 2010. The current grants brings the total to \$2,273,691 funds contributed to local non-profits and scholarships recipients since the foundation was established.

We are happy to report that the Landfall community and foundation supporters contributed a record amount of giving to very deserving charities within the Wilmington area in 2011. Once again, we saw an increase in need from the non-profit charities we serve.
