LANDFALL FOUNDATION AWARDS 66 GRANTS TOTALING NEARLY \$275,000

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

WILMINGTON, NC— In fulfilling its mission, the Landfall Foundation today (Nov. 1, 2012) presented checks to 66 Wilmington-area nonprofit agencies totaling nearly \$275,000. Today's distribution was the largest amount ever awarded since the foundation's inception in 1995. Last year, 59 agencies received grants totaling \$231,655. The 2012 awards bring to \$2.5 million total contributions to local, underserved nonprofits and scholarship recipients since the foundation was established.

The large distribution was made possible by record giving by the Landfall community and foundation supporters stimulated by increased need among area nonprofits. In addition to its largest fundraising event, the spring gala, the foundation developed new events such as the Landfall Foundation Holiday Marketplace where shoppers can purchase holiday gifts and other items from a select group of merchants who in turn donate 20 percent of sales to the foundation to fund grants.

"We are very proud to entrust personal philanthropic dollars to the Landfall Foundation because we have great confidence in how the Grants Committee will choose, analyze and follow-up on all grants. A big thanks to all our generous donors and volunteers who helped to make possible a banner year." said Landfall Foundation President Janet Burkholder.

Through the generosity of the residents of the Landfall community and foundation supporters, the foundation has provided meaningful assistance to nonprofit organizations in the categories of health and welfare, education and the arts since 1997.
