LANDFALL FOUNDATION AWARDS 78 GRANTS TOTALING \$361,000

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

WILMINGTON, NC--On November 5th, 2015, the Landfall Foundation presented checks to 78 Wilmington area non-profit organizations totaling \$361,000. This distribution was the largest amount awarded since the foundation's inception 20 years ago. Last year 72 organizations received grants totaling \$310,000. Including this year, the Landfall Foundation has now contributed a total of almost \$3.4 million dollars to local non-profits and scholarships.

The number of requests for grants has increased dramatically as governmental entities and some other charitable entities have cut their funding for non-profits. In addition to the spring *Gala* and regular contributions by community residents, the foundation has continued with its successful fundraisers to help meet these needs. These annual events are, in order of funding impact, the *Legends of Tennis* held in September, the *Holiday Marketplace* which will be held at the Landfall Clubhouse in early December, and the *Art Show & Sale* held in August.

Through the generosity of the Landfall Foundation supporters, the foundation has provided meaningful assistance to non-profit organizations in the categories of Arts, Education, and Health and Welfare since its founding. Co-Chairs for the 2015 Grants Committee are Landfall residents, Mary Brown and Karen Gibson.
