
## Financial Report for 2013

Thanks to the generosity of the Landfall community, the Landfall Foundation will have another successful year. Through September 2013, the foundation’s income was \$257,273. The annual gala “Phantom of the Opera,” Quintiles Marathon, Car Show and the Art Show raised \$250,980. Contributions and other income added \$6,293.

Administrative expenses for 2013 thus far are \$6,881 or 2.7% of income. This includes expenses for tax return preparation, newsletter printing and mailing, insurance, stationery, web site maintenance, and postage. Keeping the expense ratio low is accomplished by the work of many hard working volunteers. There are no paid employees, and there is no office.

On November 7, grants were presented to 71 local non-profit organizations in the amount of \$280,000, a new record! The scholarship program also provided \$10,663 in financial aid to eight Country Club of Landfall employee scholars and interns. Total giving from November to November is \$290,663.



Total disbursements of \$267,937 equaled 100% of net income for this year. Cumulative giving since the foundation’s start in 1996 has now exceeded \$2.7 MILLION!

Every Landfall property owner is encouraged to be a part of the foundation’s mission of “TOGETHER IN COMMUNITY GIVING.” A gift to the foundation is also a nice way to honor someone on a special occasion, to say thanks, or as a memorial. All amounts, large or small, are appreciated, are tax deductible and will be acknowledged with a tax deduction letter.

A contribution form is included with this newsletter for those who have not given this year, or would like to add to a previous gift. You may send a check to the foundation address. We also accept Discover, Master Card and Visa; payment via PayPal at the foundation website; or donations of stocks or bonds. Many corporations have Charitable Matching Gift and/or Volunteer Involvement programs for employees and retirees -- we will be happy to work with them to obtain their gifts. # Grants Awards Ceremony

Landfall Foundation Awards 71 Grants Totaling \$280,000

The Grants Awards Ceremony was held November 7, and this year 71 agencies from the greater Wilmington area received grants totaling over \$280,000 in the categories of Arts, Education and Health & Welfare.

To give you the magnitude and importance of our grants to the Wilmington community, here are some statistics. One hundred non-profit organizations applied for grants in 2013. The number of requests for grants has increased dramatically as other charitable entities have cut their funding for non-profits.

- 16 grants awarded to Arts related agencies
- 27 grants awarded to Education related agencies
- 28 grants awarded to Health & Welfare related agencies

The foundation has implemented new fundraisers, in addition to its spring gala, to help meet these needs. A new venture this year was an event co-sponsored by the foundation and Big South Auction. Supporters of the foundation contributed items to be auctioned and the foundation benefited from the proceeds. The Holiday Marketplace, which began in 2011 was held again this year at the Landfall Clubhouse on November 19, with thirty-eight vendors present.

Former Landfall Foundation President Janet Burkholder remarked that "the Grants Committee is a valuable arm of Landfall Foundation as it researches and selects qualified non-profit organizations to receive its annual grants, while the board works tirelessly to raise the funds to support the many grant requests and without the support of the Landfall Foundation many of these organizations would find it difficult to provide services in our community."

A special thank you to Mary Brown and Carol Drury who worked tirelessly as co-chairs of the Grants Committee and to the twelve volunteer members of the Arts, Education and Health & Welfare Committees who spent countless hours reading grant applications.

This is Carol's last year as co-chair and we cannot thank her enough for her leadership and support during her tenure. Replacing Carol as co-chair is Karen Gibson. Welcome Karen.

## Quintiles Wrightsville Beach Marathon

26.2 Miles of Marathon Madness:

Sunday, March 16th, 2014, 6:30 a.m.

Registration is now open and filling fast for the full and half marathon. There will also be a 3-person relay race (10-5-8 mile legs) incorporated into the full marathon. Eli's One Mile Fun Run for kids and a 5K for families will be held on Saturday, March 15th. Quintiles Marathon is a March madness themed race with over 20 schools represented along the course including UNC, NCSU, and Duke. In 2014, the marathon is being honored by the Southeast Tourism Society as one of the top 20 events.

A special attraction in 2014 will be the appearance of Frank Shorter, a gold and silver Olympic medal winner in the 1970's who has since successfully competed in a number of national and international races. Be sure to come hear him speak and cheer his run on Sunday.

The Quintiles Marathon continues to be success story. In 2013, it brought in 3,000 full and half marathon runners from 40 different states. In addition, the weekend-long events totaled 4,000 racers in the separate 5K and Eli's One-Mile Fun Run on Saturday. The race produced a \$2.2 million dollar impact to the Wilmington economy and has given a total of \$108,000 to local charities, schools and churches. The Landfall Foundation and Multiple Myeloma Research Foundation are the two main beneficiaries of this event.

In 2012 the Quintiles Marathon started a new flat and fast course with a double-loop to simplify and make the course more appealing to runners. The route gives marathon runners a fast, flat, Boston-qualifier course. Participants run through Landfall and finish at Mayfaire Town Center where they get to experience fantastic post race celebrations.
